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## Indigenous Community Programmer

Frog Hollow Neighbourhood House builds community in the vibrant Hastings-Sunrise neighbourhood of East Vancouver, located on the traditional, unceded and occupied territories of the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), Səlílwətaʔ/Selilwitulh (Tsleil-Waututh), and xʷməθkʷəy̓əm (Musqueam) Nations. We are seeking a versatile, energetic community programmer to work collaboratively with the Family Team to develop, facilitate and support programs that integrate Indigenous teachings and culture.

<b>Hours:</b>	14-24 hours/week. Flexible hours dependent on candidate's availability
<b>Salary:</b>	\$22.90 to 25.38 per hour (depending on experience) plus benefits
<b>Start Date:</b>	as soon as position is filled

### Key Duties and Responsibilities:

- Develop and facilitate an Indigenous-focused Family Drop-in programs for children, families, and caregivers.
- Collaborate with staff team to better integrate Indigenous teachings and practices into our Family Drop-in and community programs.
- Connect participants to relevant resources and services as appropriate.
- Build relationships with participants and provide one to one support for families.
- Facilitate cultural Indigenous activities for Indigenous and non-Indigenous community members and encourage cross-cultural learning.
- Connect with Indigenous cultural knowledge keepers and invite them into our programs.
- Provide outreach and promote programs to Indigenous and underserved populations.
- Share knowledge of Indigenous teachings and practices with newcomers from diverse backgrounds.
- Work collaboratively with Frog Hollow staff and community partners.
- Maintain records and statistics as appropriate.

### Qualifications:

- Self-identifies as having Indigenous heritage and can share cultural traditions with young kids.
- Experience planning and facilitating a Drop-in program for families with young kids.
- Knowledgeable about resources and experience providing referrals, especially those relevant for the Indigenous community.
- Excellent ability to work as part of a multicultural team.
- Experience working in the community-based sector and in community capacity-building.
- Sensitivity in working in a diverse community and with willingness to work with newcomers.
- Clearance from a Vulnerable Sector Criminal Record Review
- Current First Aid/CPR and Food Safe certification is an asset.
